rowing up, I always heard people say "Shanah Tovah" at the High Holidays, meaning "a good year" – short, sweet, and simple. Later I learned that you can increase your wishes to say "Shana Tovah U'Metukah," meaning "a good and sweet year." For those who want to sound more erudite it is appropriate to say

"Shanah Tovah Tikateivu V'Teichateimu," meaning "a good year, and may you be inscribed and sealed" (in the Book of Life). There are other greetings that are traditionally appropriate as well, including "Tizku L'shanim Rabot," meaning "may you merit many years," and the Yiddish "Good Yontif," derived from the Hebrew

"Yom Tov" or Good Day (though somewhat redundant since the Yiddish actually says "Good Good Day"!).

Some people say "Happy New Year," while others reserve such wishes for the secular New Year.

All of these greetings are appropriate and beautiful. To state the obvious, the only wrong greeting is no greeting at all. These days, it is more important than ever for us to stop, take the time to see each other, connect with each other, and share a genuine wish with each other that the coming year, and beyond, be filled with good.

As we prepare to enter the new year, 5784, Amy and I, along with all of us at Shaare Emeth, wish each of you a good new year, a year of sweetness, a year of health and life, a year of joy, contentment, meaning, and peace.







o continue to fulfill Shaare Emeth's mission to be an inclusive and welcoming community for all of our members and guests, our congregation's REDI (Racial Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion) Committee is excited to sponsor a Witnessing Whiteness (WW) group beginning in January 2024.



Witnessing Whiteness is a St. Louisbased program for people who are at least 18 years old and who are racially categorized as white to come together to explore the impact of white racial identity and the operation of racism in our lives and communities. Several members of the REDI committee, including Rabbi Goldstein, have participated in a Witnessing Whiteness program in the past and unanimously

found the program enriching and meaningful.

Michele Siler, Shaare Emeth board member and REDI committee member, said, "Participating in Witnessing Whiteness has given me knowledge and guidance I use daily. It gave me crucial tools to be a better listener, a compassionate learner and to be a more impactful advocate for equity in our community."

The new Witnessing Whiteness program, sponsored by the St. Louis YWCA, uses the most recent (3rd) edition of Shelly Tochluk's book, "Witnessing Whiteness," as a launchpad for discussion. This 14-week class, held over Zoom, is slated to begin in mid-January. While we do not yet have exact dates, we anticipate classes will take place on Monday or Thursday evenings from 7-9 p.m. We believe so deeply in the power of the Witnessing Whiteness program that Shaare Emeth is offering this program to Shaare Emeth members at the significantly discounted rate of \$65, which includes both the book and the 14 classes. Financial assistance is also available if needed. Space is limited to 18 participants, and participants will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

GET READY FOR DESIGN THINKING

"Education is not the filling of a pail, but the lighting of a fire."

here is a language of ignition.

Words and actions that motivate and inspire are seen in the best classrooms around the world. Those teachers know that there is something that triggers the ignition switch to move a human toward action, dedication, grit, hard work, and the fulfillment of talent, hopes, dreams, and affirmations. The ignition? It's an aura of joy, struggle, and deep practice. It may not sound very romantic, but to light a fire within a learner is to provide deep practice and passionate pursuits while also requiring serious effort and love. It's an effort-based language, and one we use at Shirlee Green Preschool.

It's the beginning season of our school year, and the children have already begun their good struggle. In our Design Thinking approach, they are examining the people and places of Congregation

Shaare Emeth, ready to decide the projects they hope to tackle.

What surprises will ignite the children of SGP this year? They've made happiness short films for kiddos stuck at home during the peak pandemic year. They've made a room-sized marble run, a doghouse for our school dog (Oakley), a better challah recipe (complete with rainbow sprinkles and in the shape of a dinosaur), they've sewn superhero costumes and blankets, and built a bunny house of sticks and gallons of hot glue.

October is for camping! It's the inaugural year of the Chaverim Campout and it will be the first overnight school trip for the oldest kids at SGP. They'll battle sleeping outdoors overnight, cooking dinner over a camp fire, observing Shabbat in the wild wilderness, and outdoor challenges they've never seen before. All that they encounter will bond the class deeply, leaving lasting memories of their time together, their courage, and their compassion.

When the campers return, they'll join in the Design Thinking fun happening on campus. It's another year of the solutionaries of SGP tackling the problems they see in their community, and bolstering




