

MAKING OUR REFORM JEWISH VOICES HEARD IN ISRAEL

Jewish community has appropriately joined in concern for, and interest in, the people, nation and land of Israel with an intensity and commitment that we have not witnessed before in most of our lifetimes. The existential threats we have

witnessed and felt have awakened within many a deep sense of loyalty. We all join in working, praying, and hoping for a better future one that will see Israel and her neighbors at peace. A future in which all who dwell in the land can realize the vision of the Israeli Declaration of Independence that promised peace and justice and equality for all.

At the same time, for the past year, voices have been raised in Israel and in support of Israel that challenge some of our core values as Reform Jews and our vision of Israel as a democratic and pluralistic nation. Ultra-Orthodox rabbis and extreme politicians have managed to gain control of key levers of power and aim to use them and the crisis of the current military actions to seek to relegate Reform Jews, women, LGBTQ+ Israelis, and ethnic minorities to secondary status.

I believe that each of us, as American Reform Jews, has an obligation to make a choice. Do we want to be written out of the story of Israeli and Jewish history, or do we want to be able to join in helping to write these stories.

Now, once again, we have an opportunity to make a difference, and to join thousands of Reform Jews in mobilizing for the WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS ELECTIONS 2025.

The World Zionist Congress controls an annual budget of over \$1 billion and represents Jewish communities from around the world, meeting every five years to:

- Set policies that affect the status of Reform Jews in Israel and millions of Israelis
- Make decisions that influence hundreds of millions of dollars in spending
- Influence construction projects and therefore the choice between settlement expansion or a path to peace, and ensuring investment in communities destroyed on October 7th

Registering to vote and make our voice heard is our opportunity to strengthen democracy and equity in Israel. While Israelis fight to keep their borders secure, we can act to secure Israel as a democratic state. Each of our votes directly impacts resources and funding for Reform synagogues, rabbis, and advocacy, ensuring Israel remains a robust democracy, committed to religious pluralism, women's rights, LGBTQ+ inclusion, and a clearer path to peace.

I'm not typically a nostalgic type. I'm the parent who (fairly easily) brings themselves to throw away our children's 3rd grade art projects. But as I sit to write this article after witnessing the amazing Gathering for Gratitude for the first time, I find myself wistfully contemplating my first year as your Executive Director. This

year has been filled with moments of profound community connection, organizational growth, and meaningful spiritual engagement. It's been a privilege to work alongside our dedicated staff, clergy, Board of Trustees, and volunteers as we continue to serve as a beacon of Reform Judaism in our community.

While I do enjoy the simple pleasure of looking at photos of my kids when they were young (I'm not a monster), when I generally think about the past, I am focused on what I can learn from it. How can the experiences of the past guide me in the future? How does it impact my decision making? My actions? Did I achieve the goals I had set for myself? To that end, I re-read the bulletin article I wrote in February about my stated goals for 2024. How did I do? What can I learn?

First, I said I was going to connect with synagogue stakeholders. I was blessed to come into this community knowing so many of you already. And I was doubly blessed to meet so many of you for the first time this past year. AND I know that there are still some of you I haven't yet had the pleasure of meeting. Please introduce yourself next time you're here and I'll do the same

for those I don't recognize when I'm at events. Through our interactions, I can/have learned much about the history and culture of our Shaare Emeth community which will inform my actions in the years to come.

In this vein, you were recently be asked to complete a congregational survey as part of our strategic planning process which we are embarking upon. This is an opportunity to ensure that your voice and perspective are heard. Thank you in advance for contributing to the future of our Temple. I look forward to sharing our new strategic plan with you over the summer.

Second, I told you that I would be focused on establishing and refining key operational processes. I am proud to say that as we begin 2025, we do so with new financial software, a new general ledger for our budget, and improved accounting procedures. We do so with additional stakeholder representation on our Board of Trustees, and new Finance, Development, Endowment, Membership, and Engagement Committees. And we do so with an expanded communications department, new HR software procedures, new Temple credit cards, new staff engagement surveys, and a new phone system. To name just a few. I expect that enacting these changes will help our decision-making processes to be more efficient and reflective of our values. I'll certainly be monitoring this over the next several months.

Finally, I had hoped to earn your trust through transparency and open communication. Ultimately, you will be the judge of whether I was able to achieve this goal. As Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks (z'l) said "A world of truth is a world of trust, and vice versa." I will strive to continue sharing the truths of our congregation with you as we journey to the future together.


It's that time of year to renew your membership in the National Mah Jongg League and receive your new 2025 card. A standard-size card costs \$14, while a large card is \$15.


Mark your calendars for our annual MLK Tzedek Shabbat

Shaare Emeth is excited to welcome Rabbi Noah Diamondstein to St. Louis for Shabbat on February 14 & 15. We hope you will join him at UH on Friday and Shaare Emeth on Saturday for two musical and scholarly experiences.

Rabbi Noah Diamondstein joined the Temple Sinai, Washington D.C. clergy team in the summer of 2020, but he has been a musician all his life. Noah's first album of Jewish music, entitled "Ashira L'Adonai," was released in January of 2019 and produced by Dan Nichols. He is a multi-instrumentalist who crosses genres from folk to jazz to pop to hard rock, and his textual influences span liturgy, TaNaKh, and rabbinic texts. In addition to his musicianship, Noah has had wide ranging experiences as a scholar of Judaism and is an inspirational teacher.
